Topic: Resumés & Recommendations

"I will instruct you and teach you in the way which you should go.
I will counsel you with my eye upon you." - *Psalms 32:8*

All seniors are strongly encouraged to complete a college resume by the time school begins in August of the senior year. This is a great way to highlight activities, church involvement, community service, and leadership positions. There are many acceptable styles for resumés, but they must be easy to understand and should be no more than one page in length. A sample resumé is included, but students may select other styles as well.

Resumés are placed in application packages with transcripts, recommendations, etc. Also, a resumé (along with a hand-written thank-you note) should be provided to each teacher when students request them to provide a letter of recommendation.

Teachers are NOT required to write letters of recommendation and usually find that they have to write them on their own personal time. Students should demonstrate a work ethic worthy of a letter of recommendation. Respect and thank-you notes are a MUST! Do not wait until "the last minute" to request recommendations. A minimum of two weeks' notice is reasonable!

Most students will have two letters of recommendation from teachers (assuming that these requests are made). Many students also choose to obtain an additional recommendation letter from someone in the community such as a coach, pastor, youth pastor, leader of a volunteer activity in which the student has been involved, family friend, etc. This can be very effective in revealing a side of the student which is not always evident to teachers. Such letters must come from parents or someone who is perceived to have influence at the particular college or university is not an effective recommender unless that individual happens to know the student really well. Not all colleges and universities require letters of recommendation, and in some cases, more is not better.
